## ART LECTURE AT B.I.

An interesting lecture on Local Art was delivered last Monday, at the British Institute, Valetta, by Mr. Attard Cassar, Master of History of Art at the Government School Art, at the Government School of Arts.

This lecture was, more or less, a continuation of another lecture by the same speaker, delivered some time ago.

In this last lecture Mr. At tard Cassar presented to his listeners eight contemporary artists, four scuiptors and four painters, all of whom have already made a name for themselves in Local Art, and who, each one of them, has many poculiarities of his has many peculiarities of his own

The Sculptors were Messrs. Vincent Apap. John Spiteri Sacco, Joseph Calleja and George Borg. Illustrations of some of the best works of each one were projected on the screen, and thus the public present could not only hear about the talents of the ind vidual artist, but also admire them. For instance mire them. For instance Apap was much admired for bust-photography religious statues, Spiteri Sacco for his marble works and the Radio City Opera house de-corations. Calleja for his for his special and personal style, and Borg for his busts and style rel g ous sculpture.

The Painters mentioned were: — Joseph Briffa whose decorations at the Senglea were:-Church (now destroyed) and those at the Qurmi Church and the Saint Paul's Church Birkirkara, were much admired, Joseph Caruana, who mainly excels in Church de-corations. Mr. Mangion, who was mainly admired for etching works, and landscapes, and Mr. Victor Soler whose early studies of groups, landscapes and later works from received still life the approval of one and all.

The lecturer used everyday language, refraining using too many tec from many technical words, which have no meaning for the layman, thus giv-ing a very clear review of some of his colleagues great works to persons who are not

necessarily expected to be experts in fine arts.

The words used by Mr. J. Galea, who thanked the lecturer on behalf of the B.I. Study Group were were work. Study Group, were very much to the point. He said that Mr. Attard Cassar had proved that Maltese could reach great heights if only they tried.
