

EXHIBITION OF PAINTINGS AT DE LA SALLE PALACE

Mr. Antoine Camilleri, who returned recently from the Ecole des Beaux Arts, Paris, neig a successful exhibition of his works at the De la Salle Palace, Valetta, last

It is always pleasant to rewww the work of young ests who have just returned from abroad because, as a rule, besides the change of mosphere and broadening horizons which give fresh stimulus to their imagination. there is usually something original which they have absorbed from their new surtoundings and which, con-monothing and which, con-mically or not, finds expres-tion in their work, Mr. Camilleri is no excep-

ion and, in his case it i, the sombre greys of the Parisian winter, the sparkle of sunshine on fresh snow and, for a change, the mellow lights and colours of the French countryside which have made the deepest impression on his mind, so far only used to the violently contrasting sunshine and s h a d o w of the Mediterranean scene.

Among the best of the Parisian landscapes are the "Pont des Arts" and "Across the Seine": and the colourschemes with predominating blue sky and ripe corn in "Harvest Times" and "Les Champs des Ble" are very nicely balanced. A welcome patch of bright colour is afforded by the picture of boats at Lugano whilst among the portraits the one in pro-file of "Marie Therese" is the most interesting.

Mr. Camilleri promises well and, if he can get himself to pay less attention to certain trifling details in his pictures and to treat his subjects in a broader manner altogether. there is no doubt that, with his fine chromatic sensibility he will in time develop into a very good landscape painter.

The exhibition is open every day from 9 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and from 3 to 7 p.m. until Sunday, January 15. 1950.
